This conference locates Relational Theory in the larger domain of psychoanalytic discourse by comparing it with seven theories of psychoanalysis. To flesh out discussion between differing clinical theories, four plenary panels will showcase the clinical work of relational psychoanalysts, which will then be discussed by psychoanalysts representing traditional psychoanalytic perspectives. Intra-panel discussion will tease out similarities and differences in how the participants conceptualize the clinical material. Finally, **Panel Six** will examine the future of the **Relational Perspective.**
